

Using Label Schemes


Elements provides a comprehensive label scheme as part of its core functionality. Labels allow faculty members to tag their activities with relevant, additional meta data, which can then be used to sort Annual Review entries as well as in reporting. Each label scheme has a fixed vocabulary, so only the options set in the system are available for labelling.

Within Elements, Labels can be displayed on different components of the Elements' system including Researcher Profiles, Scholarly & Creative Works activities, Grants & Contracts activities, Service & Leadership activities, Teaching activities, and Journals.

How to Apply a Label to an Activity

To apply a label, select the relevant Label Scheme text field and begin typing the label you would like to apply. Once you select it from the drop-down list, it will move to the top of the Labels section and begin a list.

You can add a label to an activity as you manually enter it, or you can add it at a later date from the activity details page.





Accreditation

The labels in this scheme are for accreditation reporting. To use, begin your search with the accreditation code such as AACSB and then select the appropriate label.

Area of Excellence

The International Engagement labels should be used to tag the relevant country when collaborating with global partners.

The IU Initiatives labels provide the opportunity to add labels related to key internal initiatives to any activity.
